### REV. E. W. COLLER IS INSTALLED AT MANOR CHURCH

The Rev. Edward W. Collier has been installed as pastor of the Manor Presbyterian Church by the Rev. E. Clay Frye, pastor of Trinity Presbyterian Church and moderator of the Presbytery of St. Louis.

The Rev. Mr. Collier came here from the Parish of the Eternal Hills in Colorado. Prior to his service there, he was pastor of the First Avenue Presbyterian Church of Evansville, Ind.

A graduate of the McCormick Theological Seminary of Chicago and Hanover College, Hanover, Ind., the Rev. Mr. Collier is married and the father of four sons.

### RECORD LUTHERAN RELIEF

A record 21,840,179 pounds of food and clothing valued at \$2,914,896 was sent to overseas needy in nine countries during May by Lutheran World Relief. It was the largest amount, both in weight and dollar value, in the 11 years of the agency.

L.W.R. pointed out that 21,446,361 pounds of the May shipments were surplus food supplies donated by the United States Government. Bulk of the supplies went to Yugoslavia—a total of 10,060,960 pounds for a school feeding program that serves 1,800,000 children.

### HUNGARIAN CATHOLIC CHURCH WILL MOVE

The congregation of St. Stephen of Hungary Catholic Church, 1041 Chouteau avenue, will move tomorrow to St. Mary of Victories Church, 700 South Third street, it was announced.

The move is being made because the Chouteau avenue building is unsafe and repairs would be too costly, the chancery said. Razing of the property will start soon.

The first mass for the St. Stephen congregation at the new location will be celebrated by the Rev. Stephen Vrabely, administrator, at 11 a.m. tomorrow. He will officially be installed as pastor of the congregation after the service.

The Rev. Jerome F. Schutzbach, pastor of St. Mary of Victories Church, will remain as pastor of the church.

Besides his duties as pastor of the congregation, Father Vrabely will continue as adviser of Catholic Hungarian refugees in the St. Louis archdiocese. He succeeded the Rev. John de Gyarmathy, who retired as administrator of St. Stephen Church in May because of ill health.

Father Vrabely said the congregation of St. Stephen Church is composed of about 150 families.
